## 1. Project Overview

#### 4. Message

I'd like the message of the website to be focused on the beautiful cinematography and significant themes of the movie, to emphasize its iconic status and how it once stood as a rare example of a new and startling representation of American teenagers, as romanticized as the idea was. #### 5. Tone

The tone should capture the overall brooding and intense nature of the film, which is especially highlighted in the dramatic lighting, colors, and music used in the movie.
