Project Title: Fantastic Mr. Fox Website

I am going to build a site as multiple pages off of the book, Fantastic Mr. Fox. The navigation will probably be across the top bar. There will be a wide range of topics I focus on with a high use of photography and color.

- **Home Page**— Introduce the Fantastic Mr. Fox book and plot. Highlight the subsections of the website. The home page will set the tone for a whimsical theme.
- **Author**—Roald Dahl. Brief summary of his life. He has been referred to as "one of the greatest storytellers for children of the 20th century". Dahl's short stories are known for their unexpected endings and his children's books for their unsentimental, macabre, often darkly comic mood, featuring villainous adult enemies of the child characters. His books champion the kind-hearted, and feature an underlying warm sentiment. Dahl's works for children include James and the Giant Peach, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, Matilda, The Witches, Fantastic Mr Fox, The BFG, The Twits and George's Marvellous Medicine.
- **Illustrator**—Donald Chaffin (original). History of the book cover and the transformations it has undergone.
- **Film production**—Fantastic Mr. Fox is a 2009 American stop-motion animated comedy film by Wes Anderson based on Roald Dahl's children's novel of the same name. Fantastic Mr. Fox received positive reviews from a vast majority of critics. The film currently has a 92% rating on Rotten Tomatoes with the site's consensus stating "Fantastic Mr. Fox is a delightfully funny feast for the eyes with multi-generational appeal – and it shows Wes Anderson has a knack for animation."

The film also became the second highest-rated animated film in 2009 on the site, behind Up.
- **Foxes**—Foxes are small-to-medium-sized mammals. Foxes are slightly smaller than a medium-size domestic dog, with a flattened skull, upright triangular ears, a pointed, slightly upturned snout, and a long bushy tail (or *brush*). Foxes are found on every continent except Antarctica. By far the most common and widespread species of fox is the red fox. The global distribution of foxes, together with their widespread reputation for cunning, has contributed to their prominence in popular culture and folklore in many societies around the world.
